Just a reminder that it is one member, one vote by just ONE of the opportunities available! I would stress that for members voting by E Mail, your vote will not be seen by members of the Committee or anyone else, other than the webmaster and membership secretary purely to count the votes recorded, and to determine that no member is voting more than once.

Following growing demand we hope to start a second Art for Beginners Group, meeting on a Friday, starting this month - If you would like to join please let me know.

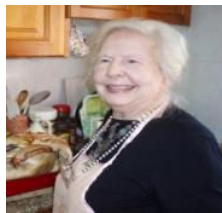
A number of members want to take up line dancing and we are making progress and hope to form a group - more news next month.
